The San Francisco Zoo would like to invite all San Francisco Unified School District K-5 classes to participate in our annual Wild About Art and Science program. This **free** program is designed to meet **Next Generation Science Standards** for enhancing student learning in science and providing an outlet for their artistic creativity. We provide **grade-appropriate lessons and activities** that focus on **California Biodiversity**, and each grade learns about a different animal. The same lessons will be used each year so teachers can plan ahead and work the activities into their lesson plans.

Each interested teacher will receive lesson plans and fact sheets (via PDF or on the Zoo's website) designed for each grade level (K-5). Each student participant may submit one drawing of the **specific California animal and habitat that are assigned to their grade level**. Each submission must meet the following requirements or it will not be considered for judging:

- On paper no larger than 9" x 12"
- Include one paragraph describing the drawing on the back of the paper
- Student's name, teacher's name, school, and grade level must be legibly printed on the back of each drawing
- Submissions must be received before February 28<sup>th</sup>, 2018
- One artwork from each grade (K-5), as well as a special day class, will be chosen by a panel of volunteer judges for a total of seven winning artists.

## Each winner receives:

- An invitation for their entire class to attend the Wild About Art and Science Award Day at the Zoo.
  At the Zoo, the class will have special animal encounters, guided tours, lunch and an award
  ceremony (at no cost to your school).
- Other prizes

Each teacher who submits their class's art will be entered into a drawing to win an exclusive behind-the-scenes tour of the Zoo's educational animal area.
